California law (Assembly Bill 1826) requires businesses and multi-family dwellings of five or more units to recycle organic waste. Organic waste is defined as food waste, green waste, landscape and pruning waste, nonhazardous wood waste, and food-soiled paper waste that is mixed in with food waste. This form is for use by businesses requesting exemption from the organics recycling service offered by the City of Hanford.
